Attendance awards

As you know we are having a high focus on children's attendance at school, as good attendance has a really positive impact on children's progress and learning.

Last term 54 of our children managed to secure 100% attendance at school. That is nearly 20% of the total number of children in school.

One class, Mrs Asghar's class had 14 of the 30 children in the group of 100% attendees, so well done to all of area 8 who managed to do it.

We have celebrated with the children by awarding certificates and stickers, and then holding a Prize Draw in a special assembly.

The lucky winner of the cinema gift card was Francesca Lord from Miss McAllister's class.

Well done to both of those winners.

Sickness

During the last 10 days of last term we were hit by a very nasty sickness bug. We had to send a large number of children home as they became ill, and had a number of staff affected too. The classes mainly affected were the year 1 and Reception classes.

Bugs and germs spread very quickly between young children as they are often in close proximity to each other.

In a number of cases children were brought back to school the day after they were sent home sick.

The school policy, and recommendation from the Department of Health, is that children must stay away from school for <u>48 hours</u> after the last time they are sick. Staff will refuse to accept children into school if they are brought back too early. Any child now being sent home from school with sickness will be given a slip stating the earliest date on which the child should return to school.

By observing this policy we hope that we can minimise the spread of nasty bugs like the one we had in school before Christmas.
