Listen to a story every day

Make a number line with numbers 1 to 10 for your child to look at every day.

Phonics

Using the objects from your colour hunt talk about the names of the objects. Break the word up into phonemes (sounds). Can you think of a rhyming word? E.g. If your object is a dice... - dice begins with 'd'.

- d/i/ce has 3 phonemes (sounds)
- mice, rice are rhyming words It's important that your child enjoys playing with words



Black and white colour hunt - Can you find black and white things around your house? Put them on a tray or plate and talk to your grown up about what you have found.

Memory game — Use the black and white objects on your tray. You need two or more people to play this game. Look carefully and try to remember all of the objects. Cover the tray with a tea towel and one player takes something off the tray without the other player/s looking. Whip off the tea towel and the first player to guess the missing object is the winner! You can make this game trickier by adding more objects and taking more than one object away. Improving your memory will make you a better reader!

Find out about...- Can you use the internet or books to find out about Zebra's. Can you think of any other animals which are black or white?
