Writing Challenge

- Draw a picture of your house and label it. What different types of materials can you name?
- Write some sentences using some of the Year 1 common words – **once, where, school**
- Write sentences using adjectives to describe a room in your house.
- Hide and seek: Write a set of instructions on how to find something in your bedroom. Think about the positional language to help find the object (in, on, under, below)
- Draw a map of one of the rooms in your house. What symbols could you have? Where will you place items?

Maths Challenge

- Practise writing numbers 1 – 30 (numerals and words)
- Practise counting in 10's all the way to 100
- Working on [Numbots](#) – practise adding and subtraction (one more, one less)
- Find some coins in the house and identify them. Which coin is worth the most? Which is worth the least? How much have you got altogether?
- Practise your number bonds to 20 – write them down. Challenge – can you write the fact families?
