

Nursery and Reception Teaching Assistants Home Challenges!!!



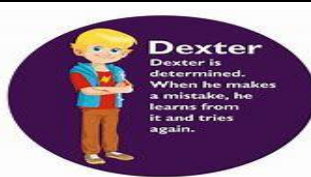
Ash

Mrs Gadsby's Challenge

Go on a shape hunt. How many different shapes can you spot in and around your home? Make a tally chart of how many you find. How many did you find of each shape? Which did you find the most of? Which did you find the least of?



Miss Cunliffe's Challenge

Can you hunt for mini beasts? How many can you find? Make a list or draw different ones you find. Create your own bug house. Can you create a bug hut for your garden? Include materials such as stones, sticks, logs, dry leaves or straw.



Mrs Redfern's Challenge

Look for a salt dough recipe on the internet with your grown up. Make salt dough rainbow shapes and carefully paint the rainbow colours. Can you make the smallest rainbow possible making sure you include all 7 colours?



Miss Carroll's Challenge

Plan and set up a circuit or obstacle course with simple exercises. Some ideas include jumping jacks, squats, touching your toes, bouncing a ball and hula hooping. Make clear instruction cards for each exercise with a picture. Challenge your family to a 20 minute fitness session!



Mrs Brown's Challenge

See how many items around the house begin with the sound 'S'. You could record your hunt by drawing them or making a collage. Think of your own treasure hunt, looking for objects starting with a different sound.



Mrs Panter's Challenge

Make a bird feeder to hang from a tree or a bird bath using a shallow container and stones or gravel. Can you name and draw your favourite birds? The RSPB have a useful website to identify the birds that you spot.



Mrs Tarakaneic's Challenge

Watch Sky TV! Lie on the ground and look up at the sky. Look at the clouds. What can you see? Can you see a shape? Can you see a face? What do the clouds make you think of? Can you make up a story using the things you see in the clouds?



Mrs Bee's Challenge

Fill a tub with water and collect a range of everyday items. Test the items to see if they float or sink and sort them into two groups. Record the two groups using a table or picture



Mrs Smalley's Challenge

Can you make a painted stone and pebble collection? Find stones and pebbles of different shapes and sizes. Use chalks, paints and felt tips to make patterns and pictures on them. You can display them in your garden or on a window sill.
