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Dear Parents and Carers

I hope that you are all safe and well. The weather this week has been incredible, and I hope that your children have all remembered to be Sun Safe Superstars when enjoying the fresh air every day. It has definitely been paddling pool and ice cream weather!

I have some wonderful news to share with you. Miss Marley's baby arrived safely into the world this morning. Orlagh Elsie looks so beautiful and we are all looking forward to meeting her when it is safe.

Our provisional plan for the potential wider opening of school after half term has now been approved by our Governors and the Local Authority. Consultation with staff groups and unions is now taking place. New and updated Government guidance continues to be released on a daily basis and, as a school, we are required to respond to this guidance appropriately. The Government will decide on Thursday 28th May whether it is 'safe' for schools to begin the wider opening process. As advised by the Education Secretary, our provisional plan is based on a very controlled and precautionary approach. We must emphasise caution, pausing and reviewing before taking the next step. The safety of our school community and staff is paramount.

With the support of our Health and Safety advisory team, we are completing detailed risk assessments and identifying control measures. These risk assessments need to be approved by the Local Authority and this all takes time. We are implementing a range of strict protective measures and this involves staff training, transforming our school environment, including the classrooms, and implementing a one-way system on site and in the building.

During the week beginning 1st June, we are continuing to support the children of Key Workers and Vulnerable children. Mrs Roberts is continuing to coordinate our Key Worker and Vulnerable children school places. leadership@cavlosei.derby.sch.uk

Our Provisional Plan for June and the Wider Opening of School

Our capacity to welcome back 'priority' children is directly linked to the available space that we have in school and the available staff that we have who can work with children in school.

<u>Available Space</u> (this is determined by social distancing measures):

- Nursery We can support 15 children at any one time.
- 9 Classrooms We can support 10 children in each classroom at any one time.

This gives us an overall maximum capacity of 105 children.

Available Staff (this is subject to change and will be reviewed on a weekly basis):

- Clinically extremely vulnerable We have staff who need to shield and cannot work with children in school.
- Clinically vulnerable We have staff who cannot work with children in school.
- We have staff with caring responsibilities who will need temporary flexible working arrangements.

Priority Children (this has been decided by the Government, NOT the school)

 Children of Key Workers (as defined by the Government) and <u>Vulnerable children</u> (as defined by the Government)

We have been supporting these priority children since school closed on 20.3.20.

We will continue to support these children everyday during June and July, from 8:55am to 3:15pm.

Priority Year Groups (this has been decided by the Government, NOT the school)

When the Government confirm that it is safe to do so, these are the children that are eligible for a school place IF we have the available space and staff.

- 2. Nursery children We have **50** Nursery children in school.
- 3. Reception children We have **90** Reception children in school.
- 4. Year 1 children We have **84** Year 1 children in school.
- We have <u>90</u> children in Year 2 and these children are in a key transition year group in an Infant School, however, this has not been recognised by the Government at this time.

You can clearly see that we have far more 'eligible' children than we have space available at school. For this reason, it is highly unlikely that we will be able to offer places to Year 1 children. We may not be able to offer places to all our Reception children. Until social distancing measures relax, we are not able to have more than 105 children in school at any one time. This is for health and safety reasons.

We will take one year group at a time in priority order. After half term, we will begin to consult with Nursery parents and carers. We will then organise teaching groups, identifying staff and classrooms, and make offers to parents and carers. Places will be offered on a part time basis. Children will be offered a place on a Monday and a Tuesday OR a Thursday and a Friday every week. Each teaching group will be given their own start time (between 9:00am and 10:00am) and finish time (between 2:00pm and 3:00pm). On a Wednesday, the classrooms will be deep cleaned in preparation for a new group. Teachers will continue to work on home learning and engagement with the children who are at home.

NO ADDITIONAL CHILDREN WILL START SCHOOL DURING THE WEEK BEGINNING 1ST JUNE.

Please do not bring your child to school if they do not have a confirmed Key Worker or Vulnerable children school place.

When Nursery children have been successfully reintegrated, we will move onto consulting with Reception parents and carers. I will continue to share information with all parents and carers on a weekly basis.

This week, you have been invited to take part in a survey where you can share your views about the wider opening of school. We will be sharing the outcomes with you and responding to your concerns. Thank you for your engagement.

As a parent myself, I understand that in order to make an 'informed choice' about whether you feel comfortable with your child 'possibly' returning to school, you need information about how school will be the same and how school will be different. We have made a 'Welcome Back Information Booklet' that will hopefully answer many of the questions that you have.

Supporting children eligible for benefits related Free School Meals

We have almost 100 children that are eligible for <u>benefits related</u> Free School Meals and they will continue to benefit from the Government's national voucher scheme. Shopping vouchers are emailed directly from 'Edenred' (the Government's chosen voucher supplier) to families. Parents and carers must continue to check their junk mail as the email could be in there. The Government are funding £15 a week for each eligible child.

All eligible families will continue to receive the vouchers until further notice.

All e-Codes have an activation date and cannot be used until that date. All e-Codes are 16 digits long. If you experience an error redeeming your voucher, delete the browsing history on your device and try again. If you continue to encounter difficulties, you can email 'Edenred' directly:
