- Click the Subject button to access video lessons, quizzes and worksheets suitable for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.
 The lessons are ordered so your child can learn along a clear plan.
- We recommend using the English and Foundation (Science, History and Geography) subjects.
- For Maths learning, we advise following the school's 'Power Maths' scheme which your child is familiar with, using the work set by your child's teacher on the school website.



BBC Bitesize Daily is a home learning tool that offers special daily broadcasts for both primary and secondary aged children
