- Read every day!
Practise high frequency words – play the game Tricky Word Trucks <https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/member-only/TrickyWordTrucks.html>
- Listen to a story: <https://www.storylineonline.net/>
- Find and read a book aloud about materials. Discuss the materials you find and place them in alphabetical order
- Write the words onto paper and read them out aloud: paper, plastic, wood, metal, environment, recycle, reuse, conserve. Can you put the sound buttons on? Can you say a sentence for each of the words?

- Write some sentences using some of the Year 1 common words – **of, said, says, are, were**

- Write a set of clear instructions on how a rainbow is made.

Make a Weather Diary

Challenge Time

Summary: Create your own weather diary and make a note on the changing weather that is happening. Spring is an exciting season which can see anything from snow to sunbathing weather. What will spring 2020 be like?

You will need: • Notepad, pencil, pens, thermometer, 2ltr plastic bottles, scissors, compass (usually one on a phone)

What to do: Decide on a location that you will record the weather every day like the garden, a balcony, your front door. Go to the same place at the same time for a fair test.

What is the temperature? Are you wearing a coat, jumper or t-shirt? Hold the thermometer to check and record the temperature.

How strong is the wind? Is your hair blowing? Look on the Met office website and check the Beaufort Scale.

What direction is the wind? Pick up a piece of grass or tissue paper and throw it above your head, which way does it go? Use the compass and work out the direction of the wind.

How much rain has fallen? Cut the top off a 2ltr bottle, invert the top into the bottle to make a funnel. Put a small amount of water into the bottle to weigh it down, mark 1 cm lines up the side of the bottle from the top of the water line and you have made a gauge to measure rainfall.
