Dear Parents and Carers

It is now 11 weeks since school closed for the majority of children and we are now 7 weeks away from the 'summer holiday'. The world as we know it has changed and we are all doing the best that we can for our families. This is my 20th year at Cavendish Close Infant School and it is definitely a year to remember! What a year to become a Headteacher! I get comfort from thinking about my Grandad. He was a Headteacher in Liverpool during the Second World War when schools closed. He was responsible for evacuating children to North Wales. I can only imagine how challenging that must have been.

Here at Cavendish Close Infant School we have 314 children and 51 members of staff. It amazes me how well we have all done with keeping in touch and reaching out to each other. Keeping up with the millions of phone calls, messages and emails has been challenging but I feel that we have continued to build relationships and stay connected. I am able to monitor all communication with parents and carers by accessing our electronic recording system. I love to read about what our children have been choosing to do – the adventures, the creations, and the achievements. I understand that the tooth fairy has been busy in Chaddesden and Oakwood over the last week and it's great to hear that so many children have mastered riding a bike without stabilisers. Well done for keeping your children busy, entertained, learning and happy for the last 11 weeks.

I would also like to acknowledge the parents and carers that have been caring for their children and working from home. This has been hugely challenging for many reasons but again we have all done our best. There have been some days when my girls have done more cartwheeling than working but they keep promising me that they will "catch up tomorrow"!

As parents and carers, we are all working hard to keep our children motivated with home learning as we know that investing in our children's education is vitally important. This week your child received a wonderful postcard from their teacher, hopefully this helped your child to reconnect with school and learning after the half term holiday.

Some of you we will see this half term and sadly some of you we will not see until September due to national social distancing measures. Our Year 2 children will not be able to have the usual 'send-off' with celebrations, performances, events, and special assemblies. We are busy planning what we can do remotely to create special memories. Maybe our Year 2 children can think of good ideas and email them to us? **Mrs Reader** is the Year 3 Leader from Cavendish Close Junior Academy and she is working on a special video for the Year 2 children. We have agreed that the children will remain in the same classes and we have begun to share important information to enable the transition to be as smooth as it can be. **Mrs Tague** is the Acting Principal and we are in close contact so that we can continue to develop the growing partnership between our schools. I will absolutely visit the Year 2s when they are Year 3s and they have settled at their new school. One day it will be safe for us all to meet again!

We are all aware that national social distancing measures will be in place for some time. As you start to reconnect with your friends and your family, please make safe choices and be patient.

Our Plan for the Wider Opening of School

Our capacity to welcome back 'priority' children is directly linked to the available space that we have in school and the available staff that we have who can work with children in school.

Available Space (this is determined by national social distancing measures):

- Nursery – We can support 8 children at any one time.
- 3 Early Years Foundation Stage classrooms – We can support 8 children in each classroom at any one time.
- 6 Key Stage 1 classrooms – We can support 10 children in each classroom at any one time.

This gives us an overall maximum capacity to have **92** children in school at any one time. This is less than one third of our school population.

Available Staff (this is subject to change):

- We have **Clinically Vulnerable** Staff who are not able to fulfil their role in school.
- We have staff who live with a family member who is **Clinically Extremely Vulnerable** and so they are not able to fulfil their role in school.
- We have staff with caring responsibilities who need temporary flexible working arrangements.

Priority Children (this has been decided by the Government, NOT the school)

1. **Children of Key Workers** (as defined by the Government) and **Vulnerable children** (as defined by the Government)

We have been supporting these priority children since school closed on 20th March. We will continue to support these children for the next 7 weeks.

Priority Year Groups (this has been decided by the Government, NOT the school)

These are the children that are eligible for a school place **IF** we have the available space and staff.

2. Nursery children – We have **50** Nursery children in school.
3. Reception children – We have **90** Reception children in school.
4. Year 1 children – We have **84** Year 1 children in school.

You can see that we have far more 'eligible' children than we have space available at school.

We will take one year group at a time in priority order. We will consult with Nursery parents and carers next week. Parents can choose if they would like their child to be considered for a place or not. **Places will be offered on a part time basis.** Children will be offered a place on a Monday and a Tuesday **OR** a Thursday and a Friday **every week.** On a Wednesday, the classrooms will be deep cleaned in preparation for a new group. Teachers will use this time to continue working on home learning and engagement with the children who are at home.

Please do not bring your child to school if they do not have a confirmed Key Worker or Vulnerable children school place.

When Nursery children have been successfully reintegrated, we will move onto consulting with Reception parents and carers. I will continue to share information with all parents and carers on a weekly basis. When we reach our capacity, we will not be able to offer any more places until national social distancing measures are relaxed.



Supporting children eligible for benefits related Free School Meals

We have almost 100 children that are eligible for benefits related Free School Meals and they will continue to benefit from the Government's national voucher scheme. Shopping vouchers are emailed directly from 'Edenred' (the Government's chosen voucher supplier) to families. The Government are funding £15 a week for each eligible child.

All eligible families will continue to receive the vouchers until further notice.

All e-Codes have an activation date and cannot be used until that date. All e-Codes are 16 digits long. If you encounter difficulties redeeming your vouchers, you can email 'Edenred' directly:

Supporting vulnerable children

As a Safeguarding Team, we are continuing to do all that we can to support our school community. The safety of children and our staff is paramount.


Well done to Alexander in class 4, who's been writing a super animal A-Z list.
