Mrs Howett's Challenge

Huff and Puff!

What materials can you find around your house? Can you huff and puff like the wolf? Which materials moved? Next use a hair dryer. Did the materials move? What about an empty washing-up liquid bottle? Squeeze the bottle as hard as you can to try and move the materials. Which moved the materials the furthest- your huffing and puffing, the hair dryer or the bottle?



Mrs Bee's Challenge

Three Little Pigs Adventure

Can you go on an adventure in your local woods, park or garden and make your own house? What could you use to make it? You could use sticks or even stones for bricks. Now, act out the story of the three little pigs. Maybe your grown ups and siblings can join in too? Which character will you be? Have fun telling the story!



Mrs Brown's Challenge

Finding Three

Can you go on a hunt around your house and garden and look out for collections of three? Maybe you can find three spoons, three apples or three sticks. How many groups of three have you found? How many objects do you have altogether? Look for this number on your number line. Have a go at drawing the things you have found. Can you label them?



Mrs Panter's Challenge

Make a house and character

Can you make a house for each little pig? What could you use to make their house? You could use Lego, cardboard, sticks or any other recycled materials you can find. How strong is each house? Do you think the big bad wolf could blow them down? Can you make a big bad wolf mask using a paper plate or some cardboard? Remember to take photos and send them to the nursery email.



Mrs Tarakaneic's Challenge

Draw a map of the story

Can you draw a map of the story? Start with the three little pigs. Next draw the straw house. What happens next? Can you draw the wolf blowing the straw house down? Draw the wooden house and the house made of bricks. What happens at the end?
