Reading Challenge

Read the poem on the next page. called 'Summer is Here', chosen specially for you from your teachers.

Talk about the poem with a partner. Use these questions to start your conversations:

- V- What do the words 'strategies' and 'humble' mean? You could use an online children's dictionary to help you. Can you think of synonyms (a word that means the same thing)?
- I – How do you think the author was feeling?
- P- What do you think will happen to the reader if they follow the 'strategies' such as: "Always strive to learn more".
- E- Did you like this poem? What did you like about it?
- R- What has the reader got to do before they 'pack up their bag'?
- S- Can you summarise in one sentence what the poem is about?

Be a wordwise whizz-kid. Read it, say it, cover it, write it. Keep it fun - use pens, chalk, salt/ sand in a tray. Make some flashcards together and put them around the house to say when you see. We are on to some of the more unusual sounds now but have a go.

Day	Focus sounds	Common exception words:
Monday	g (giant), c (mice), ch (chef/school)	like, come push, pull
Tuesday	ph (graph) wh (white)	full, your, says, go

- Looking through the poem can you find all the rhyming words?
- This poem is from your teachers to you. Could you write them a poem back?

Maths Challenges




Look on the Oak Academy Website. It has easy to follow lessons. For example:

Flip a coin – record as a **tally chart** which side it landed on. Predict which side will it land on most?



Do time challenges with your family. Set a time like 1 minute and see who can get the most. For example star jumps. Can you record your scores using **more than/ less than** maths symbols like this:



Tom got 32 and Gemma got 41
 $41 > 32$ so Gemma is the winner

- Summer is here... can you remember all the seasons and in order? Can you remember the months and in order? Make up some actions to help you E.g January (rub arms as if cold), February (blow a kiss for Valentine's Day)....
- Put ice cubes in different locations and see which melts the fastest. Can you work out why?
- Talk to an adult about school for them. What was the same/ different?
