It will be a different Christmas for us all this year as we must continue to limit who we mix with for the safety of ourselves, our families, and our community.

In school, we have missed our Christmas assemblies and performances very much, but staff have worked incredibly hard to capture the true meaning and magic of Christmas across school. Everywhere you go, there are children singing, Christmas trees, cheeky elves, and Christmas joy. The Christmas jumpers are superb, and we are looking forward to Christmas dinner today and parties tomorrow. Every class has decorated their classroom door and they look splendid as you walk around school. The class Christmas card display has been a source of enjoyment and pride and the children have been working on safe surprises for their families – Coming your way soon!

Coronavirus Safety Measures

It is now clear that our temporary staggered start and finish times will need to continue until at least Easter (1st April 2021) as we continue to respond to challenges associated with the pandemic. All children are in school for 6 hours a day – 5 hours of learning and a 1-hour dinner time.

We will continue to support families with more than one child <u>at our school</u> with our 'siblings plan'.

- → **Do not arrive on site earlier than you need to**. Aim to be on time. Avoid gathering. Move on when you can.
- → Only one adult can bring your child to school. Avoid bringing older siblings on site where possible.
- → All adults on site should wear a face covering in addition to social distancing at 2 metres. Be respectful. Do not enter our Reception area or approach a member of staff without wearing a face mask.

Our Breakfast Club has been open all term and we have been able to safely maintain our class bubble system. At Breakfast Club, children calmly enjoy their breakfast, followed by table-based activities.

We have not been able to open our After School Club for reasons linked to our Risk Assessment. Keeping children safely apart in class bubbles for approximately 3 hours would be restrictive. The priority for the end of the day continues to be the thorough cleaning of school. Our After School Club will remain closed until at least Easter (1st April 2021). We are sorry for the inconvenience that this causes to working parents and carers who would use this facility. We must continue to prioritise safety and well-being.

We are extremely grateful for your patience, cooperation, and understanding. The national and local picture continues to be deeply concerning for staff, and we must all follow our Risk Assessment and COVID expectations for the safety of our school community. Please make safe choices and stay apart where possible. Minimise the time that you are on site for your safety and the safety of others.

All <u>Year 2</u> parents and carers need to apply for a Junior (Year 3) place in a new school for September 2021. This must be done directly with Derby City Council.
