


We hope that you are enjoying our new topic for this half term. Can you tell a story beginning and ending with 'Once upon a time....happily ever after?'

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 <b>Word Wise</b>	<p>Today's focus is the phoneme (sound) sh. Sometimes 2 graphemes (letters) stand side by side to make one sound. 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 <b>Maths</b>	<p>Today's focus is on 'Combining two groups including zero'.</p> <p>You will need: counting objects and a part-whole model.
