
Remember, if the word has more than 1 syllable and ends in a 'y', we take away the 'y' and add an 'i' before adding –ness or -ment.




Words can be changed by adding the suffixes ful and -less. For example, care can become care**ful** or care**less**. A suffix is a group of letters added on to the end of a root word.

For example, -ful and -less can be added to the end of words to make adjectives.

Adjectives with -ful mean 'full of'; -less means 'without'.

Open the play script and read some of this week's focus words.













When words have more than one syllable and end in -y, we need to replace the -y with an i before we add the -ly.




