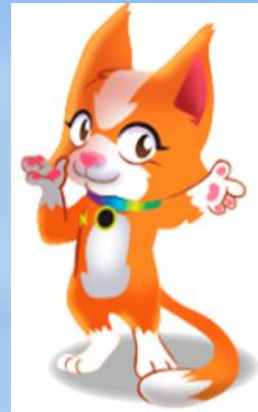

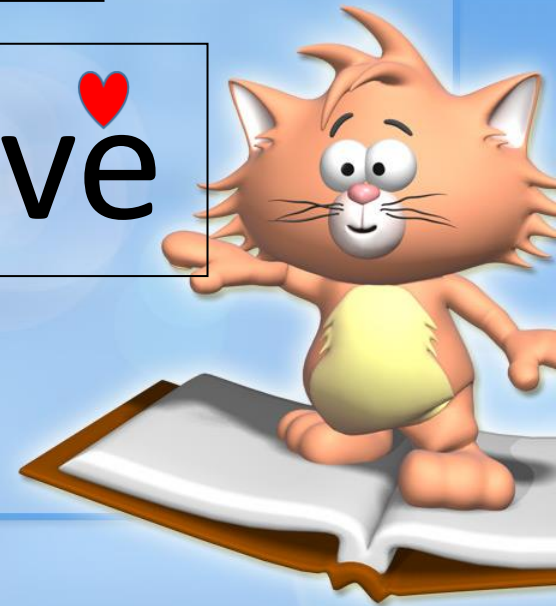

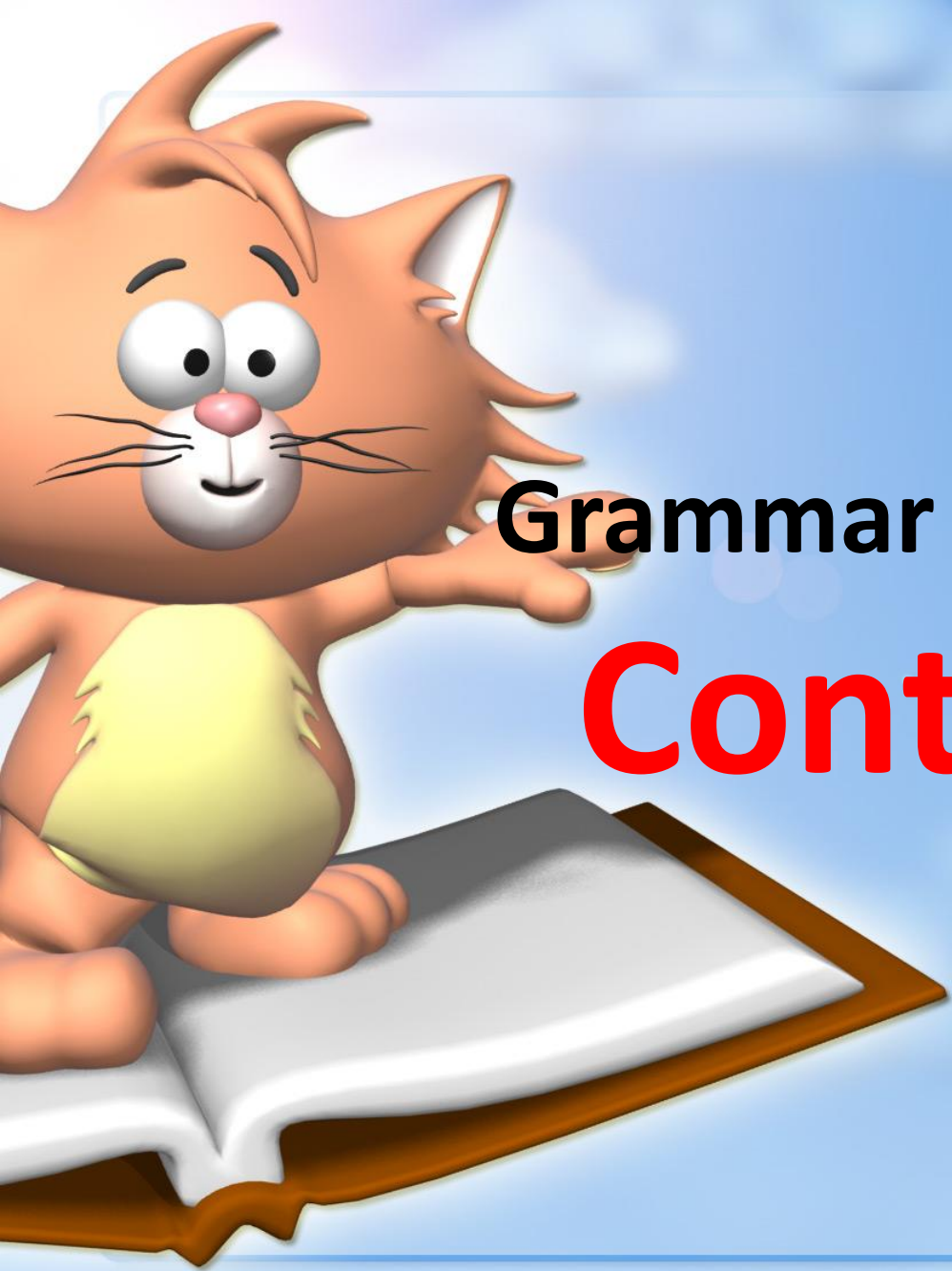

# Contractions

(connecting words)

- Contractions is a fancy name for words that are joined together, they make them shorter.

Huh?

Example:

did not = didn't

would not = wouldn't



# Here are some more examples

he's = he is

she's = she is

haven't = have not

shouldn't = should not

wouldn't = would not

they're = they are

they've = they have

Where's the muffin man? He's starting to annoy me, I haven't seen him or his girlfriend in weeks.

They've gone to Disney Land, it's the best!



# Contractions (connecting words)

- The apostrophe (') is used to shorten the word.
- In **wouldn't** (**would not**) the apostrophe replaces the 'o' in not.
- In **they're** (**they are**) the apostrophe replaces the 'a' in are.

That makes sense, but do I have to use contractions?





The answer to that my green friend is no. Contractions don't have to be used, it's just quicker to use them.

Ask your teacher/parent/ friend or look it up in a book. However if you're unsure you don't have to use the contraction. For example write **did not** instead of **didn't**. The only time you shouldn't use contractions is in formal letters

*I really want to use contractions when I write, but sometimes I'm not always sure when to use the apostrophe.*

*Thanks for the advice. I think we could all do with a quick test.*



# Remember:

**Contractions** are words that have letters missing.

An **apostrophe** shows where the letters have been missed out.
