

Contractions (connecting words)

• Contractions is a fancy name for words that are joined together, they make them shorter.

Huh?

Example:

did not = didn't
would not = wouldn't



Here are some more examples

```
he's = he is
    she's = she is
  haven't = have not
shouldn't = should not
wouldn't = would not
 they're = they are
 they've = they have
```

Contractions (connecting words)

- The apostrophe (') is used to shorten the word.
- In wouldn't (would not) the apostrophe replaces the 'o' in not.
- In they're (they are) the apostrophe replaces the 'a' in are.

That makes sense, but do I have to use contractions?



The answer to that my green friend is no.
Contractions don't have to be used, it's just quicker to use them.

Ask your teacher/parent/ friend or look it up in a book. However if you're unsure you don't have to use the contraction. For example write did not instead of didn't. The only time you shouldn't use contractions is in formal letters

I really want to use contractions when I write, but sometimes I'm not always sure when to use the apostrophe.





To make reading and writing quicker, sometimes, two words are joined together to make one word. The missing letters are replaced by an apostrophe. These words are called **contractions**.

cannot = can't lam = l'm

Remember, apostrophes are also used to show possession as well as omission of letters, words or numbers. For example, Jane's hat blew away.
