o In school we practise recognising, blending and segmenting words in daily Wordwise sessions. This is because reading is very important and the foundation to all subjects.



Tuesday - Shared Reading — This week's shared reading is 'How to Catch a Dragon' by Caryl Hart and Ed Eaves. You might recognise one of the characters from a book we have used in school before. Use the blank story board below to think of;

A Title — You need to think of a good title for your story. Write it in the box in bubble writing.

The Setting — Decide where your story will be set. Draw a picture in the box. Can you think of adjectives to describe the setting? Write a list, this will help you when you write your story.

<u>Two Characters</u> – Think of two characters. You could be one of the characters. Draw the characters in the box. Think of some adjectives to describe them. Write a list, this will help you when you write your story.

A Beginning — Think about how you are going to start your story. Set the scene. Draw a picture.

A Middle – What happens in the story? Is there a problem that needs to be solved? Think about what happened in the book 'How to Catch A Dragon', what was the problem in that story? Could you magpie any ideas? Draw a picture.

The End – What is the resolution to the problem? How will your story end? Draw a picture.

Now that you have completed your story board and planned your story, you are ready to start being an author.

• Thursday — Today you can begin to write your story. Use your story board to help you. Set the scene and introduce you characters. Use some super adjectives to describe them. Remember to use super sentence starters. There is a sentence opener word mat in the resources for this week to help you, it looks like this;

- ✓ use connectives and , because




**Reach for the stars** — Use different sentence starters.
