Welcome to the new school year. I hope that everyone has had a happy summer. Six weeks goes far too quickly when you are having fun!

I have enjoyed precious time with my family and friends, although I have definitely drunk too many luxurious iced coffees. I have enjoyed reading books and walking my puppy, Nelly Tiger. I am feeling refreshed and ready for another action packed and successful year at school.

Welcome back to the families that we know so well and a special welcome to the new families that we are looking forward to getting to know. Our Key Stage one children returned to school on Friday. You will have seen how our school grounds have developed over the summer. Our Phase 1 outdoor projects are now complete and ready to be used safely during school time. Our newly developed Nursery outdoor area includes a section of our path at the front of the building and all families walk through this area at the start and end of every day. Please ensure that your children stay on the path as we are politely asking that you do not allow your children to play in the Nursery outdoor area before or after school, thank you for your cooperation. The Reception outdoor area at the back of school includes a gigantic sand den and an amazing water wall. This area is zoned off and should not be accessed before or after school. Our fantastic trim trail on the 'Blossom Field' can be used all year round by our Year 1 and 2 children to support their physical development. This area is zoned off and should not be accessed before or after school.

I will be sharing the outcomes from our June 2022 parent questionnaire in the next week. The responses were overwhelmingly positive and I am extremely grateful for the respect and appreciation shown to our full staff team, who work tirelessly to create a wonderful school environment for children to grow, develop and learn. 


## Dear Cavendish Close Children,

## A reminder of key useful information

- ✓ We have a **Breakfast Club** from 7:45am and an **After School Club** until 5:45pm. Email Mrs Roberts for more information. Clubs@cavclosei.derby.sch.uk
- ✓ Children are **not allowed to ride bikes or scooters** on school premises for safety reasons.
- ✓ Your child needs a waterproof coat with a hood and a sun hat every day. Please ensure that all your child's clothes are named.
- ✓ Your child will need **sturdy school shoes** every day. Heels, slip on shoes and sandals are not allowed as they are not safe for outdoor play and PE.
- ✓ Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children need a PE kit in school every day. Children need a drawstring bag (not a rucksack) with a white T-shirt and a pair of black or navy shorts both named. Pumps are not required as children will go to the hall in their shoes and take part in indoor PE with bare feet.
- ✓ Children are **not allowed to wear jewellery** to school. Only one single pair of studs is allowed.
- ✓ Your child should not bring any belongings, toys, or resources into school from home.
- ✓ Your child needs to bring their bookbag and diary to school every day. Please use
  our wallet style bookbags with small handles. Avoid buying your own bulky satchel
  style bag with a strap as these do not fit in drawers easily. Your child can have one
  keyring on their bookbag if they would like.
- ✓ Your child has their own water bottle and a piece of fruit is available every day at snack time. Your child should not bring any drinks or snacks from home.
- ✓ We encourage as many Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children as possible to have a 'funded' school dinner. Our meals are made on site by our catering team. You can access our menu so that you and your child know what to expect for dinner every day. Our menu is based on our children's favourite meals. Your child will be well supported at dinner time. If there is a day where you know your child will not enjoy a school dinner, they can bring a healthy packed lunch and a drink.
- ✓ Children are encouraged to read daily at home with an adult signing the reading diary so that children can progress on the Reading Rainbow. To build children's fluency and independence, it is helpful for them to read their books more than once.
- ✓ Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children can access Collins eBooks, Numbots and Education City using their own log in details and continue learning at home.

Our uniform plays a key role in promoting the ethos of our school. It provides children with a sense of belonging and identity and sets an appropriate tone for education.

#### Safety on Wood Road

Please play your part and help to keep our school community safe.

- ✓ Please park considerately away from school and walk. Do not park in front of the gates or on the zigzag lines. Do not park on corners, on pavements or blocking driveways at all. If you need to drive to school, then park safely and considerately away from school and walk. Please allow sufficient time for this.
- ✓ Please drive slowly on Wood Road. Do not make a 'U-Turn' on Wood Road outside school this is not safe or considerate. Do not stop in the middle of the road to drop off adults and children. Do not mount the kerbs to park on the pavements.
- ✓ Please keep moving when walking and keep the paths clear. Do not gather or wait by the gates – this is not a helpful meeting point.
- ✓ Please do not stand and smoke by the Wood Road gates. This is not the welcome we want for our families. Please be considerate. Smoking and vaping is not allowed on the school site.

Derby City Council Public Protections Officers and members of our Safer Neighbourhood Policing Team are hoping to be able to visit us regularly so that we can challenge parents and carers who do not drive, park, or behave safely on Wood Road.
