Dear Parents and Carers,

Children are not allowed to ride bikes or scooters on our school site. Please help us to keep our paths safe.

If children come to school on a bike or scooter, they must dismount at the Wood Road gates and walk on the school site.



If you drive to school, please park safely away from school and walk. Please do not block driveways or mount pavements. Respect our neighbours and prioritise keeping children safe.

If you drive on site to drop off or collect children from a club, drive very slowly and park in a designated parking space.



Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children can have a 'free' school dinner every day. Costs are covered by the government. Our meals are cooked freshly every day and you can prepare your children for what they will choose by looking at our menus.



Please find time every day to read to and with your children. Enjoying reading together will help your children to develop as confident readers who choose to read. We hope that you found last week's reading workshops helpful and that you feel motivated and able to help with your child's reading at home.

A reminder of key useful information

- ✓ We have a **Breakfast Club** from 7:45am and an **After School Club** until 5:45pm. Email Mrs Roberts for more information. Clubs@cavclosei.derby.sch.uk
- ✓ Children are **not allowed to ride bikes or scooters** on school premises for safety reasons.
- ✓ Your child needs a waterproof coat with a hood and a sun hat every day. Please ensure that all your child's clothes are named.
- ✓ Your child will need sturdy school shoes every day. Heels, slip on shoes and sandals
 are not allowed as they are not safe for outdoor play and PE.
- ✓ Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children need a PE kit in school every day. Children need a drawstring bag (not a rucksack) with a white T-shirt and a pair of black or navy shorts both named. Pumps are not required as children will go to the hall in their shoes and take part in indoor PE with bare feet.
- ✓ Children are **not allowed to wear jewellery** to school. Only one single pair of studs is allowed. These will need to be removed or covered with micropore tape for PE
- ✓ Your child should not bring any belongings, toys, or resources into school from home.
- ✓ All children in nursery and school need a book bag. Please use our wallet style bookbags with small handles, they can be purchased from our school office. Your child needs to bring their bookbag and diary to school every day. Your child can have one keyring on their bookbag if they would like to personalise it.
- ✓ Your child has their own water bottle in their classroom and a piece of fruit is available every day at snack time. Your child should not bring any drinks or snacks from home.
- ✓ We encourage as many Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children as possible to have a 'funded' school dinner. Our meals are made on site by our catering team. You can access our menu so that you and your child know what to expect for dinner every day. Our menu is based on our children's favourite meals. Your child will be well supported at dinner time. If there is a day where you know your child will not enjoy a school dinner, they can bring a healthy packed lunch and a drink.
- ✓ Children are encouraged to **read daily** at home with an adult signing the reading diary so that children can progress on the 'Reading Rainbow'. To build children's fluency and independence, it is helpful for them to read their books more than once. Please find time for regular reading at home.
- ✓ Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children can access Numbots and Education City using their own log in details and continue learning at home.

Our uniform plays a key role in promoting the ethos of our school. It provides children with a sense of belonging and identity and sets an appropriate tone for education.

Safety on Wood Road

Please play your part and help to keep our school community safe.

- ✓ Please park considerately away from school and walk. Do not park in front of the gates or on the zigzag lines. Do not park on corners, on pavements or blocking driveways at all. If you need to drive to school, then park safely and considerately away from school and walk. Please allow sufficient time for this.
- ✓ Please drive slowly on Wood Road. Do not make a 'U-Turn' on Wood Road outside school this is not safe or considerate. Do not stop in the middle of the road to drop off adults and children. Do not mount the kerbs to park on the pavements.
- ✓ Please keep moving when walking and keep the paths clear. Do not gather or wait by the gates this is not a helpful meeting point.
- ✓ Please do not stand and smoke by the Wood Road gates. This is not the welcome we want for our families. Please be considerate. Smoking and vaping are not allowed on the school site.

Derby City Council Public Protections Officers and members of our Safer Neighbourhood Policing Team do visit us where possible so that we can challenge parents and carers who do not drive, park, or behave safely in the local area.
