


You can have one visitor from home to join you for a Maths lesson soon. The visitors are going to be so impressed with your careful counting and awesome problem solving.

All children should arrive at school on time between 8:40am and 8:50am. It's really important that all children can enter school and start the school day with their friends. Every minute counts.


