






Palaeontologist

fossil	Fossils are the remains or traces of plants and animals that lived long ago. Fossils give scientists clues about the past.
Jurassic	A time in history when dinosaurs were around.
prehistoric	Time before written history
species	Animals who look different but are the same type.
extinct	Animals are no longer living. Dinosaurs became extinct millions of years ago.
habitat	Where an animal lives.
diet	What an animal eats.
carnivore	Animal that eats meat only.
herbivore	Animal that eats plants only.
omnivore	Animal that eats both meat and plants.
volcano	An opening in the Earth's surface, usually found in a mountain, where gas, hot magma and ash escape.




