Do we know our online friends?

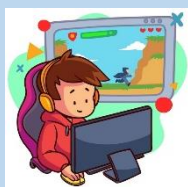
It is always important to remember that our online friends may not always be who they say they are.

They may use a fake name or date of birth to make them seem appear the same age as you.

They may change their location to make it seem like they live close to you.

They may use avatars so you don't know what they look like.

They may try and encourage you to share personal information with them.



What is personal information?

Personal information is information that identifies you, some examples are:

Your date of birth

Your address

Your phone number

Photographs of you

The school you go to



If anyone asks you for any of this information when you are playing a game online, **DO NOT** share it with them.

Safety tips for playing games online

- ❌ Never accept friend requests from people that you don't know.
- ❌ Never use a webcam or live streaming app with people that you have met online.
- ❌ Never share photographs of yourself.
- ❌ Never share personal information.
- ❌ Never meet up with someone that you have only spoken to online.
