Wow Event/Hook

Finding little white eggs under a leaf **Topic Outcome**

We hope to hatch caterpillars from eggs and watch as they change and grow into butterflies.

We will be looking at fruit and vegetables too, looking at what's inside. We will be learning that we need to eat lots of different fruit and vegetables.

As Readers we will:

- Read the story of The very hungry caterpillar
- Follow the words with our fingers and talking about characters and settings in stories.
- Clap out syllables in words and listening to the sounds we hear in words.
- Listen for words that rhyme and sound nearly the same.

As Authors we will:

- Hold pencils, paintbrushes, pens using finger and thumb pincer grip.
- Draw circles and lines to make recognizable pictures.
- · Begin to write letters from my name.

Sharing our learning What's Outside?

Talking Togteher Focus:

- Talking together about what we see, feel and hear.
- Learn new words so we can talk about fruit, vegetables, caterpillars, butterflies and other insects.
- Share stories together about mini beasts and insects.

As Scientists we will:

- Look at and draw daffodils, butterfly eggs, caterpillars and other mini beasts.
- Try to find where mini beasts live and what they like to eat
- Cut open fruit and vegetables to find out what is inside!

As Artists/Designers we will:

- Draw and paint pictures of caterpillars, flowers and butterflies.
- Thread shapes to design and make our own caterpillar necklace.
- Print using fruit and vegetables.

As Mathematians we will

- Look for and make patterns of shape, colour and size
- Recognise numbers from 0 to 6
- Count small groups of objects by touching and saying a number for each one.

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As researchers we will:

- Find out what caterpillars and butterflies really like to eat.
- Find out which insects can be found around our school

As a computer expert we will:

 Take photographs using the iPad of insects we find.

As Musicians we will:

 Listen to sounds that percussion instruments make and describe whether sounds are loud or quiet, fast and slow.

As PE superstars we will:

- Use the hall to move in different ways.
- Use bikes and other equipment outdoors to use our hands and feet alternately.
- Know to stop moving when an adult says 'stop'
- Know that fruit and vegetables keep us healthy

As Citizens we will:

• Continue developing positive attitudes about the differences between people.

Every day we play listening games focussed on blending phonemes to hear words and segmenting phonemes to sound talk words. We listen for words that sound 'nearly the same' and clap the syllables in words.






