


# Dear Cavendish Close Children,

- All Nursery aged children are entitled to 15 hours of funded education. We offer part-time 15-hour
  places at the beginning of the week (all day Monday, all day Tuesday, and Wednesday morning) or
  at the end of the week (Wednesday afternoon, all day Thursday, and all day Friday).
- Some Nursery aged children are entitled to 30 hours of funded education. We offer full-time 30-hour places (all day Monday to Friday).

## Start of the day arrangements

- All doors will open at 8:40am every morning.
- Early Years Foundation Stage (Nursery and Reception) children will enter school directly into their classrooms.
- Key Stage 1 (Year 1 and Year 2) classrooms are on the first floor.
- Children from Classes 4, 5 and 6 will enter school through the Year 1 door at the end of school (between Nursery and Class 3). Staff from Classes 4, 5 and 6 will be on the door to welcome the children and to communicate with parents/carers.
- Children from Classes 7, 8 and 9 will enter school through the Year 2 door at back of school (between Class 1 and the hall). Staff from Classes 7, 8 and 9 will be on the door to welcome the children and to communicate with parents/carers.
- All children should be in their classrooms ready for registration at 8:50am.

## **End of the day arrangements**

 The end of the school day will continue to be staggered to ease congestion on the paths around school and on site.

- The gates will be opened at 2:50pm for parents and carers to approach classrooms and the playgrounds.
- Nursery children will be dismissed first at 2:50pm directly from their classroom.
- Reception children will be dismissed next at 3:00pm directly from their classrooms.
- Year 1 and 2 children will be dismissed at 3:10pm. They will be led down the staircases and out onto their playgrounds before being safely dismissed to their responsible adults.
- In reality, there will be a dismissal window of about 10 minutes (3:05pm to 3:15pm) to enable all the Year 1 and Year 2 children to come safely down the staircases and out onto their playgrounds. Parents and carers are asked to wait patiently on the playgrounds by the correct class sign. Children will be dismissed one at a time by staff. Parents and carers must wait until it's their child's turn to be dismissed.
- Children from Classes 4, 5 and 6 will meet their parents and carers on the Year 1 playground.
- Children from Classes 7, 8 and 9 will meet their parents and carers on the Year 2 playground.
- The staggered timings should help parents and carers who collect siblings from different classes and year groups.

- The Junior Academy begin to dismiss their children at 3:15pm.
- Some children find arriving at school or leaving school at the same time as lots of other children overwhelming and/or distressing. We will continue to offer bespoke arrangements as appropriate.
   If you would like to request flexibility at the start or end of the school day, please come and speak to us.
- Please keep left as you approach school. When parents and carers have seen their children enter school safely, they can walk back down the drive.
- Parents and carers should not block the path around school. Please keep moving or wait to the side
  of the path near school, allowing others to pass safely.
- It is helpful if only one adult brings your child to school and collects them. Reducing numbers on site, will help to ease congestion on site.
- Please try not to arrive on site too early, arriving on time is really helpful. We aim for all children to be Attendance HEROes (<u>Here Every day</u>, <u>Ready and On time</u>).

#### For safety reasons, children are not allowed to ride bikes or scooters on the school site.

Children coming to school on a bike or scooter must dismount at the Wood Road gates and walk with their bike or scooter.

We do have a bike shed near the car park. Bikes and scooters can be left at parents/carers own risk. They should be secured by parents/carers. School will not accept responsibility for any damage or loss incurred

## For safety reasons, smoking/vaping on the school site is not allowed.

#### For safety reasons, dogs and other pets are not allowed on the school site.

Families with guide/assistance should approach the school to secure permission to access the school site. We currently have one assistance dog accessing our site regularly.

## Key useful information

- ✓ We have a **Breakfast Club** from 7:45am and an **After School Club** until 5:45pm. Email Mrs Roberts for more information. Clubs@cavclosei.derby.sch.uk
- ✓ Children are **not allowed to ride bikes or scooters** on school premises for safety reasons.
- ✓ Your child needs a waterproof coat with a hood and a sun hat every day. Please ensure that all your child's clothes and belongings are named.
- ✓ Your child will need **sturdy school shoes** every day. Heels, slip on shoes and sandals are not allowed as they are not safe for outdoor play and PE.
- ✓ Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children need a PE kit in school every day. Children need a drawstring bag (not a rucksack) with a white T-shirt and a pair of black or navy shorts both named. Pumps are not required as children will go to the hall in their shoes and take part in PE with bare feet.
- ✓ Children are **not allowed to wear jewellery** to school. Only small stud earrings are allowed. Hoop earrings must not be worn for school.
- ✓ Your child should not bring any belongings, toys, or resources into school from home.
- ✓ Your child needs to bring their bookbag and diary to school every day. Please use
  our wallet style bookbags with small handles. Avoid buying your own bulky satchel
  style bag with a strap as these do not fit in children's drawers easily. Your child can
  have one keyring on their bookbag if they would like.
- ✓ Your child has their own water bottle and a piece of fruit is available every day at snack time. Your child should not bring any drinks or snacks from home.
- ✓ We encourage as many Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children as possible to have a 'funded' school dinner. Our meals are made on site by our catering team. You can access our menu so that you and your child know what to expect for dinner every day. Our menu is based on our children's favourite meals. Your child will be well supported at dinner time. If there is a day where you know your child will not enjoy a school dinner, they can bring a healthy packed lunch and a drink.
- ✓ Children are encouraged to read daily at home with an adult signing the reading diary so that children can progress on the Reading Rainbow. To build children's fluency and independence, it is helpful for them to read their books more than once.
- ✓ Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children can access Numbots using their own log in details and continue learning at home. Little but often use of Numbots improves maths fluency.

Our uniform plays a key role in promoting the ethos of our school. It provides children with a sense of belonging and identity and sets an appropriate tone for education.

## Safety on Wood Road

We work in partnership with Derby City Council, our local ward councillors, and our safer neighbourhood policing team to make Wood Road as safe as possible at the start and the end of the school day. Please play your part and help to keep our school community safe.

- ✓ Please drive slowly on Wood Road. Do not make a 'U-Turn' on Wood Road outside school this is not safe or considerate. Do not stop in the middle of the road to drop off adults and children. Do not mount the kerbs to park on the pavements.
- ✓ Please park considerately away from school and walk. Do not park in front of the gates or on the zigzag lines. Do not park on corners, on pavements or blocking driveways at all. If you need to drive to school, then park safely and considerately away from school and walk. Please allow sufficient time for this.
- ✓ Please keep moving when walking and keep the paths clear. Do not gather or wait by the gates this is not safe or helpful. This is not a helpful meeting point.
- ✓ Please do not stand and smoke/vape by the Wood Road gates. This is not the welcome we want for our families. Please be considerate.

Derby City Council Public Protections Officers and members of our Safer Neighbourhood Policing Team visit us occasionally so that we can challenge parents and carers who do not drive, park, or behave safely in the local area.
