Dear Parents and Carers,

It's October and autumn has definitely arrived, Mr Roberts will be working hard to keep our paths free of leaves! We are so lucky to have such beautiful trees, new and old, on our site. Thank you to our families who stay on our paths and use the litter bins. We appreciate you keeping our site clean and tidy. Please don't walk up the grass in front of school, it just isn't safe and we really don't want anyone to fall. The ground is uneven and wet underfoot. Take your time and use the paths on site please.

I am really proud of how well all the children have settled into their new year groups and classes. We have welcomed about 100 new families into our school community, mostly into the Early Years but some into Key Stage 1 as well. There are about 20 languages spoken within our school community now – how wonderful! It is important that our children leave us with an understanding of the world that they are growing up in, having learned how to live alongside, and show respect for, a diverse range of people. Thank you to everyone for being welcoming, kind and respectful.

Children are not allowed to ride bikes or scooters on our school site, this includes younger siblings on balance bikes. Please help us to keep our paths safe.

If children come to school on a bike or scooter, they must dismount at the Wood Road gates and walk on the school site.





If you drive to school, please park safely away from school and walk. Please do not block driveways or mount pavements. Do not park on the zigzag lines. Respect our neighbours and prioritise keeping children safe.

If you drive on site to drop off or collect children, drive very slowly (5mph) and park in a designated parking space.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children can have a 'free' school dinner every day. Costs are covered by the government. Our meals are cooked freshly every day and you can prepare your children for what they will choose by looking at our menus.





Please find time every day to read to and with your children. Enjoying reading together will help your children to develop as confident readers who choose to read. We hope that you found our recent reading workshops helpful and that you feel motivated and able to help with your children's reading at home.



Parent and Carer Communication Charter

We expect parents and carers to abide by our communication charter. We expect parents and carers to always be polite, respectful, positive and solution focused with all school staff.





Children should attend school every day until we break up for the half term holiday on Friday 24th October. Children should not be taken out of school for a family holiday.

We are required to report unauthorised absences to Derby City Council who may issue fines to parents and carers.

Good attendance matters, please enable your child to be an Attendance HERO this autumn.

Good attendance is 96% or higher.

Thank you to all our parents and carers who are polite and respectful towards all staff at our school every day.







Thank you for expecting your children to walk up the path as they arrive at school. This ensures that only clean shoes come into school. Your co-operation is appreciated.

Please do not attempt to take a shortcut up the grass as the grass is very uneven in places. Please take your time, be safe and stay on the path.

Parents and carers who drive on site to drop off or pick up from our Breakfast Club or After School Club must drive very slowly (5mph) and park in a parking bay. Please do not use the disabled bays if you are not a blue badge holder.





This term's After School Curriculum Clubs will continue this half term. They all finish at 4:10pm. Parents and carers are not allowed to drive or park on site to pick up from these clubs.

Bikes and scooters that are left in the bike shed unsecured are left at the owner's risk. Consider using a bike/scooter lock to secure your child's bike/scooter.

Thank you for expecting your child to dismount from their bike/scooter when they get to the Wood Road gates. This keeps our school site safe for everyone.
