Below is some useful information on ways in which our children and families can stay safe. It is essential that even though children will not be left unsupervised, they understand how to stay safe and why this is so important.

Keeping safe in the sun

Whilst we recognise that some sun is good for us, we understand that it is important that our children grow up with sufficient knowledge of sun safety and are supported in becoming

Road Safety

Stop, look, listen and think!

Children are highly unlikely to be crossing roads by themselves, however preparing our children with knowledge about road safety is very important.



A few basics to remember include:

Never cross between parked cars- Children are shorter than adults and therefore will not be seen by motorists/cyclists if they are stood next to a car.

Put gadgets and phones away- Don't be tempted to look at a screen whilst crossing-you need to be fully alert. Adults need to model this too.

Take earphones out- Listen for traffic as well as look for it.

Always use a crossing if one is available- Don't be tempted to take a short cut.

Don't run- always walk.

Bike and scooter safety

Children can travel so fast on their bikes and scooters; they often appear fearless and love to race ahead.

It is important to teach children some basic safety tips to keep them safe when out and about, even when you are with them.



- Children should wear helmets to protect their developing brains. You may want your child to wear wrist/knee pads too.
- Be bright, be seen- wear high visibility clothing to ensure other road or path users can see you coming.
- Stop, look, listen- Know when to stop.
 Always come to a complete stop at kerbs and walk across the road with your adult.

Water safety

As the weather heats up, water can be a danger to our children. Whether it be fun in a pool or hot tub, your child must **never be left alone**.

Supervision from a responsible adult is a MUST.

As adults we must also educate our children about the dangers of open water such as the sea, rivers and ponds.
